Now in its second year, AART.BOXX is an exhibition that highlights the creative talents of young Australian artists (under 25) who have a disability. Initiated by Accessible Arts, this exhibition features works by emerging artists selected from a national call-out for entries. This year, the committee comprised of nominated artists and tutors from ROOMIES ARTSPACE, including John Goldsmith, Leon Suchecki, Nancy Sumpner, Natalie McCarthy and Marlysse Medina. This process was facilitated by Accessible Arts, which encouraged artists with and without a disability to critique and select artworks as part of a collective.

The resulting exhibition embraces the exploration of materials such as video, photography, drawing, puppetry and ceramics. This is expressed through works such as Jarrod Wendt's military inspired ceramics and Kelly Walker's hauntingly rendered bird titled Morning Flight. Collaborations between artists are also featured in this exhibition. The Money, a gangster inspired video was created in collaboration between 5 artists: Joel Smith, Nathan O'Connell, Gareth Busch, Lincoln Fletcher and Michael Meliush. Facilitated by arts workers from Art IM (Art in Motion), The Money, presents a comic intersection between Mafia-like characters and a popular T.V game show.

This year AART.BOXX features Artists on Screen. This presents an opportunity to expand the exhibition content and create a platform for works composed from digital media. This technology is constantly reshaping the possibilities within the arts and communication. For artists with limited mobility, digital media can enable greater access to the manipulation and construction of images, sound and literature. Whilst challenging perceptions of disability, these artists continue to broaden the lexicon of contemporary art and its audiences.

The exhibition and professional development opportunities within AART.BOXX, aim to be a stepping-stone for the careers of many of these emerging artists. Please join us in congratulating these artists on their work. Enjoy!
