Workshops

A lot of effort and skill was put in by the artists that ran classes in the first term. Tamsin McGuin looked at improvisation along with other skills to develop individual strengths and creativity. By the end of the six weeks the competence and enthusiasm was shown by participants on the final day. Michelle Sams used craft wood, paints along with odds and ends to create multi arts first parade of wearable art. Members proudly exhibited their body armour which consisted of bracelets, chest plates, skirts and spears. Some of the work will feature in a later Access Arts exhibition. Brad Nunn conducted the Visual Art workshop which used collage as a foundation for the workshop. Participants created sculptural works using paints, various magazines and other materials.

"Totems Tell Us Who We Are"

The first block of workshops for 1999 "Totems tell us who we are" was completed on April 15. The workshop participants together created a Totem Pole utilising the indigenised objects produced in the workshop.

"Our Songs...Our Stories"

"Our Songs...Our Stories" is the title for the second block of workshops for 1999. It is a collaborative music project which aims at combining traditional Aboriginal and western instruments and techniques. Focusing on the utilisation of music as a tool of self expression. Local musician Ant McKenna is facilitating the workshops; activities include playing instruments, singing, writing and recording songs. The workshops conclude on June 10.

Biota Street Sculpture Project

The project is underway and going well, workshops take place Wednesdays & Fridays 9.30 - 11.30am outside Yuggera Place, Wolston Park. Local indigenous artist Rick Roser is working alongside indigenous and nonindigenous patients from the John Oxley Memorial Hospital to create 6 seats, which appear to be carved sandstone rocks. The seats are to be incorporated into the Biota St redevelopment. The workshops are due to



conclude June 18 if the weather permits.

I am sending you this message stick

"I am sending you this message stick" aims at combining digital technologies and the artists' cultural origins to produce a timely and culturally directed conversation. It is envisaged the exhibition will travel to the Australian Museum, Sydney in 2000, and possibly tour to regional centres. It's desired the exhibition will be constructed from a 12 week cultural and self identity program conducted in a secure care environment.

Acting Technique for Film and Television

Course Information

One year course with 3 yearly intakes 6 x 8 week blocks, plus 2 week filming block 2 nights per week, 6.30 - 10.30 pm 100 classes per year.
