KURT BOSECKE

visual artist

Kurt Bosecke is a visual artist whose work has developed a distinctly comic and narrative style through his interest in fantasy, the natural world and screen culture. Kurt works mainly in paint, ink and posca, which he uses to explore the expressions and habitats of real and mythical animals. His current work is evolving as an intensely colourful, visually powerful body of work based on beastly mythology and abstraction. Kurt's work has continued to develop, and he has garnered an enthusiastic following for his lively paintings. His work is included in numerous private collections. In 2017 Kurt was the recipient of the BankSA Best Visual Art and Design Fringe Award and has been a weekly finalist twice. He has been exhibited nationally and internationally in the George Town Festival Malaysia, 2016, Deaf Arts, Yogyakarta, Indonesia 2018 and most recently as part of Melbourne's Asia TOPA Festival 2020.



ALISTAIR BRASTED

singer

Alistair has sung with the State Opera Chorus in a number of productions including *The Ring Cycle* (2004), *Cavalleria Rusticana*, *Tosca* and *Aida* and at many Adelaide concerts and events. He has studied for many years with Peter Hopkins and made his debut as a soloist with Tutti in 2003 for *The Singing of Angels* in St Peters Cathedral for the 2003 Come Out Youth Arts Festival. In 2005 Ali sang the lead role of Oliver in Tutti's Australian production of *Between the Worlds* and took minor principal roles in both of Tutti's co-productions with Opera SA and Various People: *The Shouting Fence* (2009) and *The Magic Flute* (2011). More recently Ali has begun singing with Tutti's premier small vocal ensemble *Thank God it's Friday*.



JOSHUA CAMPTON

performer, writer and filmmaker

Joshua is a self-identified disabled artist and proud Larrakia, Wadaman and Karajarri man. Originally from Darwin, Josh has performed throughout Australia and worked with Back to Back Theatre, No Strings Attached, Restless Dance, and Kurruru Performing Arts. He has appeared in 4 professional films: Maurice's Symphony (Andrei Gostin), Mutt (Sarah West), Jeremy the Dud (Ryan Chamley) and What bird is that? (Gaele Sobott-Mogwe). In 2012 Josh was awarded an Australia Council Jump Mentorship. Josh has participated in Tutti's film making and performing arts programs since 2015 and in 2018, his film, Landscape Diaries screened at the Sit Down Shutup and Watch Film Festival. He is currently working on Of Boys and Men, a new dance work led by Paul Gazzola, and is involved in two episodes of the ActNow State Theatre collaboration for Decameron 2.0. Josh's dream is to one day act in Home & Away. "I'd like to get more acting work."



CALEB CARR

musician and visual artist

Caleb has lived in Clare since 2010 and is a prolific musician and visual artist who also makes films. His art is inspired by vintage 1950's and 1960's magazines and his music is published on bandcamp under the handle Matryoshka Doll.

Aimee is a self-identified disabled artist with Williams Syndrome who began singing for people when she was one year old. Aimee says "I have wanted to be an artist all my life", and joined the Tutti Choir as a young teenager in 2004. She has sung with the choir ever since as a chorister and soloist. Aimee is also a founding member of Tutti Arts and performed the lead role in Circles (2004), the lead role of Isabella in Between the Worlds (2005) and in Mouth Music (2005). She also performed the role of The Daughter in the US/Australian collaboration Northern Lights, Southern Cross (2007). In late 2007 Aimee performed in the role of Isabella in Interact Theatre's production of Between the Worlds in Minneapolis USA. In 2009 she performed in the Tutti-State Opera production of The Shouting Fence, and in 2011 in the Tutti-SOSA-Various People production of The Magic Flute. Since 2012 Aimee has been a member of Tutti's acclaimed all female pop group The Sisters of Invention. In October 2014, the group released their debut single This Isn't Disneyland which was screened at the UN headquarters in New York and soon after added to QANTAS inflight entertainment. The group's debut album The Sisters of Invention was released in May 2015 with their second album due for release in early 2021. They have performed widely interstate and on television, with highlights being the hit closing act of the 2018 Special Olympics (at Titanium Security Arena) and performing on the ABC's Get KrackIn. The Sisters were due to present their first cabaret show Are You Ready for This in the 2020 Adelaide International Cabaret Festival and are now hoping to present it in 2021.



DANIEL DINHAM

costumer and video maker

Daniel lives in the Clare Valley and likes to make costumes and videos, specialising in TIKTOK shorts. "I enjoy it because it helps me express my emotions in ways I couldn't if the platform didn't exist. It's a great compliment when someone likes my videos." Daniel's dream is to become a Professional Cosplayer and to be hired as a costume designer and creator for both Avcom and Cosplay. He makes all his costumes and is an excellent hand sewer.



KATHRYN EVANS

visual artist, performer and dancer

Kathryn has appeared in numerous Tutti productions including The Shouting Fence (2009), Ten Ways to Love (2010), The Magic Flute (2011), Frozen Girl (2017 DreamBIG Festival), in which she was the central Character and most recently Say No More for the 2018 OzAsia Festival. For many years Kathryn has performed with Restless Dance, most recently in Intimate Space (2018) and Zizanie (2019). Kathryn is also a visual artist who incorporates birds, flowers and animals into her highly decorative painting and printmaking. Kathryn's strong interest in classical paintings has played a big part in the development of her style and technique and her work is increasingly sought after for its elegant use of line and delicate colour. Kathryn has exhibited in several group and studio exhibitions with Tutti Arts, including Explorasi Titik, Yogyakarta (2016). Her paintings are included in numerous private collections.



TRISH FERGUSON

writer and performer

Trish has sung in the Tutti Choir since 2004 and joined the Tutti Performing Arts Ensemble in January 2005. She has been part of a number of creative developments and performances including Between the Worlds Adelaide 2006 and Horsham 2005, Northern Lights, Southern Cross – directed by Jeanne Calvit for the Bundaleer Forest Festival and Adelaide Fringe Festival 2007, The Shouting Fence directed by Cheryl Pickering 2009. She has played major roles in Ten Ways to Love directed by Juha Vanhakartano – 2010; ONE – directed by Daisy Brown 2011; The Magic Flute aka The Circus of the Seventh Seal of the Sun – directed by Cheryl Pickering 2011, and Frozen Girl, directed by Juha Vanhakartano for the 2017 DreamBIG Festival. Most recently she performed in Say No More, directed by Catherine Fitzgerald for the 2018 OzAsia Festival. Since 2012 Trish has also acted in a number of training films, including music videos for the Office of Women Respect the Line, and Escape Artists for EBL.



JOEL HARTGEN

actor and film editor

Joel is a founding member of Tutti Arts and has had minor roles in many productions including Between the Worlds (2005) and Northern Lights, Southern Cross (both the Australian (2007) and American (2009) productions). Joel also performed in The Shouting Fence (2009) and The Magic Flute (2011). He played minor roles in Tutti's productions of Ten Ways to Love (2010) and Frozen Girl (2017) and took the lead role of The Bowerbird in BEASTLY! This production toured to Malaysia for the 2016 George Town Festival and OzAsia Festival 2016 before being presented in Indonesia in January 2018. Joel also loves creating videos and photography, and enjoys editing with Adobe Premiere Pro. He is a member of Tutti's instrumental ensemble Quirkestra.



RACHEL HIGH

actor and dancer

Rachel has performed widely with many South Australian and UK companies. These include D Faces of Youth Arts, Restless Dance Theatre, AMICI Theatre/Dance Company, London, No Strings Attached and Tutti Arts. In 2007 she wrote and directed the short film Brown the Dirt, and also worked with Netta Yaschin to develop a cabaret piece Turkish Delight. In 2008 she worked with UK artist Julie McNamara to create and perform Steak & Chelsea at Feast 2008 and in London in 2009.

In 2009 she played the role of Kylie in the short film Work Ready, for which she was nominated for Best Performance in the South Australian Screen Awards. In 2010 she was a support actor with Back to Back in Food Court in the Adelaide Festival. Since 2003 Rachel has worked as a dance/drama tutor with Restless Dance, St Patricks Special School, No Strings Attached Theatre of Disability and Hills Community Options. In 2013 Rachel joined the Restless Senior Ensemble and in 2015 performed in the premiere of the double bill What's A Nice Girl Like You Doing In a Place Like This and Naturally. In 2016 Rachel directed First Dates for Debut 5: the dancers direct. Most recently Rachel performed in the Restless season Intimate Space as part of the 2017 Adelaide Festival. In 2012 Rachel started a Bachelor of Arts at Flinders University which she is about to complete.



LORCAN HOPPER

actor, film maker and dancer

Lorcan is a proud disabled artist bringing enormous energy, enthusiasm and charisma to his work. He is a director and actor, known for The Loop (2019) and Necessary Games (2009), and he has worked extensively with Tutti Arts since 2011, performing in Frozen Girl (2017), BEASTLY (2017) and Speed of Light (2018). Lorcan became a member of Restless Dance Theatre in 2004 with highlights being Safe from Harm 2005 and Salt (2014) developed by Rob Tannion, director of CircusOz. Lorcan has choreographed four works for Restless Dance Theatre's Debut program including High Voltage which was performed for the Australian High Commission in Pt Moresby. In 2013 he was a guest director for Rawcus and in 2015 he directed a piece for ADT's Rough Draft called Wild Clown Circus.



DOUGIE JACOBSSEN

actor and radio presenter

Dougie has been with Tutti Arts since 2006 and performed in many productions including Mouth Music (2006), Northern Lights, Southern Cross (2007), Curfew (2008), The Shouting Fence (2009), Ten Ways to Love (2010), The Magic Flute (2011), and Frozen Girl (2017). In 2009 Dougie won the inaugural Allan Sloan Young Citizen Community Service Award for support of young people with disability. He enjoys a regular spot on Peter Goers' ABC Radio evening show every Tuesday night, reporting on matters related to disability, football and Tutti.



JAMES KURTZE

film maker, artist and techno geek

James Kurtze is a Visual and New Media artist who works from the Tutti studios and has been successful in receiving a number of grants to develop his work in new media. James' work Dexter Aliens was chosen to be projected onto the Festival Theatre sails during the 2011 SALA Moving Image Festival, and went on to be screened at the first Sit Down Shutup and Watch Film Festival in 2014. James has presented his work at numerous conferences including Conquering Public Spaces, Czech Republic, AS WE ARE, (W.A. Arts Activated, NSW), and IVAA (the Indonesian Visual Arts Archive) in Yogyakarta, Indonesia (2014). He has presented work in collaboration for the 2015 and 2016 OzAsia festivals. James' first major film EYE TV (available on Vimeo) won three awards for 'Best Special Effects' at the 2013 Oska Bright Film Festival, UK and Picture This Festival, Toronto Canada. James is one of the founding committee members of Australia's first disability led film and new media festival entitled Sit Down Shutup and Watch.



GRACE LAM

small business entrepreneur and performer

Grace joined the Tutti Performing Arts group in 2019 after being part of the Tutti Kids and Youth program (TKY) for several years. Grace has learned piano for many years and performed at TKY showcases, and church and school concerts. In 2018 Grace performed in Tutti Arts' acclaimed cross cultural production Say No More during the OzAsia Festival, and developed the confidence to speak publicly. In 2019 she pitched her handmade card and candle business at Unley Council's Fish Tank. Grace now sells her cards at school markets and fetes and wants to reach a wider market.

"My greatest strengths are my creativity, my strong ideas and my visions for designs and performance staging." Grace donates a percentage of her sales to charity including Tutti Arts.



JENNA MAY

performer and visual artist

Jenna is a performer who has always been drawn to comedy and wants to be a stand-up-comic. Jenna is also a member of Tutti's Quirkestra and plays percussion. She has appeared in many Tutti productions including Between the Worlds (Australian production) Northern Lights, Southern Cross (Australian production), The Shouting Fence (2009), Ten Ways to Love (2010), The Magic Flute (2011), Frozen Girl (2017), and most recently Say No More for the 2018 OzAsia Festival. Michael is currently involved in the development of *That's What She Said* with Company AT, which is due for further creative development as part of InSpace 2021. Michael joined Tutti's Film and New Media program in 2017 and has proved himself to be a strong comedy writer, screen performer and voice over artist.

Hannah is a 24 year old digital artist who lives with autism.



JACKIE SAUNDERS


visual artist and performer

In 2010 Jackie was chosen as a NAIDOC award winner for being an exceptional role model for young indigenous people with Foetal Alcohol Syndrome. In 2020 she won the Dawn Slade-Faull Art Award which will enable her to present her first solo exhibition 'Salt and Sand' at Dentons Fisher Jeffries during November 2020.



MATT SHILCOCK

movement alchemist, choreographer and creative producer Matt is a South Australian based contemporary dance theatre artist. Diagnosed at birth with Osteogenesis Imperfecta, commonly known as 'brittle bone disorder', he spent much of his youth in a wheelchair before learning to walk at the age of fifteen. Matt has been performing since 2009 and has worked as a choreographer, dancer and actor with many local, national and international performing arts companies. including Murmuration Dance Theatre, No Strings Attached, Restless Dance Theatre, Kaldor Public Arts, Kaaos Company (Finland), Willman Dance Company (Finland), Mass Box (China), Touch Compass (NZ), Full Radius (USA), Candoco (UK), Independence (UK), FreeWill Theatre (HK) and the Van-L Dance Company (UK). Matt is currently an associate artist with Australian Dance Theatre where he is continuing the development of his own choreographic methodology and movement language Osteogenuine which combines his passions for dance and choreography with his interests in alchemy and alternative healing. Matt's work Alchemia Exteriores explores the development and application of choreographic scoring systems in the creation of original dance works. Kate Watts is a member of Company AT and currently employed at Tutti Arts as a Trainee Producer. She made her professional debut in the Company AT production *Impersonal Space* for the 2019 DreamBIG Festival, and in October she is delighted to be playing the lead role in the regional tour of *Impersonal Space*. Kate studied drama and music at school, and these allowed her to explore her love of performance, creating characters and also to enjoy creating sets and costumes. "I have loved singing, dancing and acting my whole life". In 2018 she was awarded the Year 12 Drama Prize and Year 12 David Bradley Memorial Prize. Kate wants to further her creative career and understand about producing work in order to empower more disabled artists to share their voices with the world. In 2020 she began study of occupational therapy so that she can further pursue her passion for disability, advocacy and the arts through both a creative and therapy platform.



LEE WITCZAK

singer and disability advocate

After a promising early career as a singer and wardrobe mistress at the Adelaide Festival Centre, a major stroke left Lee with acquired brain injury in mid-life. For the last 8 years she has been Chair of the disability led Sit Down Shutup and Watch Film and New Media Festival – a film festival and filmmaking workshop program led by people with learning disabilities. Lee has stepped into the role of public spokesperson and advocate for this remarkable festival on the local, national and international stage and has become renowned for her ability to highlight inequalities for people living with disabilities with charm and humour. Lee is most proud of the Sit Down Shutup and Watch regional workshop program which enables disadvantaged people to realise they too can be film makers. Lee loves it when people new to film making discover that they can put disabled people central to the narrative. And yes, she still loves to sing!

ABOUT TUTTI ARTS

Tutti Arts is an independent inclusive multi-arts organisation with a vision to take the work of artists to the world. This is underpinned by a deep sense of community that seeks to address the social and professional isolation of learning disabled artists. Tutti does this through providing skills development

in a vibrant, collegial studio environment where new and emerging artists explore and develop their individual practices in visual, performing and digital arts with professional artists.

This encourages strong creative relationships, and allows artists to develop their own collectives and networks, and realise how

far they can take their work. In 2017, Tutti Arts was awarded Arts South Australia's Ruby Award for Sustained Contribution to the Arts by an Organisation. 200 artists participate in Tutti's Brighton, Port Adelaide and Barossa Valley programs.

ABOUT STAND & DELIVER

In 2019 Tutti Arts received
NDIS ILC grant funding to run a
program called Stand & Deliver
which aims to increase the
capacity of individual artists or
groups of artists with disability to
promote their work to the world.
The program was tailored to the
goals and skills of individuals
and offered a mix of one-on-one
and group sessions.

Over 40 emerging or established disabled artists who had a track record in performance, music or art making - including film and video art - participated in the project in order to help advance their careers. This is the first showcase of its kind, and we hope there will be more.

Led by program coordinator Catherine Fitzgerald and other industry professionals, Stand & Deliver has equipped these artists with the vocal confidence, strategic skills and audio-visual material to create and deliver presentations which attract interest in their work.
