SHAKESPEARE GOES DEAF

A 20's version of Shakespeare's THE WINTERS TALE - original but not eyebrow-raising. After inumerable adaptations of the Bard it's easy to be blase. That is until you realise that this production will be mounted by Australia's only professional Deaf Theatre Company.

'One gesture is the shortest distance between two points' commented Marcel Marceau at his press conference last week. This year through hundreds of performances Australia wide, the New South Wales Theatre of the Deaf have been demonstrating in their highly inovative style the pure communication power of visual language.

The Company's year began with performances at the Sydney Festival and Melbourne's Moomba, followed by a tour of Tasmanaia and one of New South Wales - the highlight of which was a special performance before His Royal Highness, The Prince of Wales, during his Sydney visit. Negotiations are currently underway for a season in Paris and a tour of Holland later this year.

From July 23rd at the Stables Theatre, audiences will have an opportunity to see this exciting Company present THE WINTERS TALE, Directed by Ian Watson and Nola Colefax, using a combination of visuality, movement, sign language and voice together with songs written especially for this production. This will be presented as part of the International Year of the Disabled Person celebrations.
