Banjobe Hunt is an artist whose work is inspired and influenced by his Thai heritage, his connection with animals and love of his adopted homeland, Australia. Working in a variety of media across the art forms of drawing, painting and printmaking, Banjobe's work has a way of making the "every day" rich, colourful and exotic. Banjobe works out of the Tutti Visual Arts studio in Brighton and has exhibited extensively throughout South Australia and in numerous Adelaide Fringe and SALA Festivals.

Tutti Arts works across many art forms to promote the professional development of artists with a learning or intellectual disability. The quality of Tutti Artists' work is recognised through awards, development grants, and invitations for artistic works to be presented to local, national and international audiences.

The Tutti Visual Arts Studio is a vibrantly dynamic and creative program that incorporates professional facilitation of painting, drawing, printmaking, digital art and sculpture, four days a week across three locations to over 50 artists with a disability.
