Tutti Kids and Youth Program

The Tutti Kids and Youth Program provides Adelaide's only out of school hours Performing Arts program where young people living with disability collaborate in a social setting to develop their creativity through singing and song-writing, music, dance, movement, drama and theatre skills. The focus of each group is tailored to the participants and the skillset of the tutors.

Led by specialist arts educators, the hour long classes are held once a week and follow the public school term calendar. Classes are small so that everyone feels confident and able to contribute. The program is NDIS registered and subsidised generously by the Department of Communities and Social Inclusion for non-NDIS registered children.

1. This is My Show

4. Singing In the Rain

This well-known musical show stopper was chosen by the group to perform, due to the Tutor, Josh, and the Tuesday groups love of musicals. This combination of drama and music is a direction the group want to pursue in terms to come.

5. Ghostbusters

This song was chosen by Jos for the group to perform. The group have worked hard to incorporate movement and drama for their performance of this song and also enjoyed the opportunity to be in costume!

6. Down By the Bay

The origins of this song is unknown but it has been used as a teaching tool by Brittany; the exploration of rhyming as a precursor to song writing.

7. Vocal Solo - Mila Wuttke. What the World Needs Now

Lyrics by Hal David and music composed by Burt Bacharach.

Mila is a keen singer with a sweet voice who participates in dance classes through the week. This is a creative ability that will be fostered in terms to come.

8. What's that Animal

This song that will be introduced by Jos through a poem from The Jungle Book. The song was written by Brittany as a method for recognising the children's love of animals, animal sounds and a means for developing vocal dexterity in the children.

9. Banaha (Banana)

A traditional song from the Congo. The words translate to "At the foot of the pineapple tree, Yaku ladles a banana into his Aunt's red hat"

10. You've Got a Friend in Me from Toy Story

The finale for the show! This is a well-loved song for all the artists. The meaning behind the words have been conveyed in Makaton signing, the images that have been projected throughout the song and through sentiements often displayed between the Tutti Kids and Youth participants.
