# **Conditions of Sale**

Tickets purchased through EASE are sold under the following conditions:

- 1. Tickets are not transferable. Tickets are sold to individual subscribers on the understanding that they are attending the booked event.
- 2. Tickets are sold to staff members of an organisation on the understanding that they are attending an event as a support person for the clients of that organisation, and under no other circumstances.
- 3. EASE staff reserve the right to refuse sale to anyone who they believe is not eligible to purchase tickets.
- 4. Tickets must be paid for within 14 days of receiving an invoice from EASE.
- 5. EASE will purchase tickets, where possible, to suit a subscriber's particular requirements. Sometimes these requests will not be possible to fulfil.
- 6. EASE ticket prices are determined in negotiations with each promoter, thus ticket prices will vary greatly. An administrative commission is added to this ticket price and that total price is the one quoted and sold to subscribers.
- 7. There is no exchange or refund of tickets. A booking is taken as a financial commitment to purchase those tickets booked.
- 8. EASE staff reserve the right to cancel or suspend membership if conditions of sale are breached.

But Ro's biggest problem is Kenny, the apple farming cowboy who sings really awful country music and stands on his head in restaurants. # **Disability Discrimination Act**

On March 1st, 1993 discrimination based on disability became unlawful under the Federal Disability Discrimination Act. The following is a brief overview of the Act.

#### What is Discrimination under the Act?

Different treatment of people with a disability is not unlawful. Treating people with a disability less favourably than people without a disability under the same circumstances is discrimination.

#### What is Disability under the Act?

The definition of disability is meant to be as broad as possible. It includes physical, intellectual, psychiatric, sensory, neurological or learning disabilities. It also includes physical disfigurement and the presence in the body of a disease causing organism, e.g. the HIV. It is also unlawful to discriminate against associates of people with disabilities.

#### What areas are covered?

Discrimination against people with a disability is unlawful in employment. accommodation, education, access to

# Titus: 2 sides to a rare Shakespeare



EASE members with a taste for fine Shakespearian theatre will have a rare opportunity to experience two outstanding productions which take distinctive and unusual approaches to the bard's Titus Andronicus, a play rarely performed in Australia. Both productions are in association with the Melbourne International Festival of the Arts.

First, there's the production of Titus Andronicus by Romania's National Theatre of Craiova. The company has emerged from the recently liberated Eastern bloc nation as one of the world's most startlingly original theatre companies. Their production of Shakespeare's history of revenge, power and bloody conflict is informed by the recent terrors of Romanian history. This is described as a masterpiece production with impeccable sets, a mesmerising cast and 12 international awards to its credit. The play is performed in Romanian with simultaneous English translation.

Moving beyond the language barrier in other ways is *Titus*, an ambitious multi-lingual adaptation of Shakespeare's play by David Pledger. *Titus* combines Aboriginal, Asian, European and Anglo-Saxon dialects to reflect the social fabric of contemporary Australia.

premises, sport, activities of clubs and the provision of goods, services and facilities, among other things. Services include banking, insurance, finance, entertainment, transport and services provided by any profession or trade.

#### How Can Complaints be Made?

Complaints are lodged with the Disability Discrimination Commissioner, by the person directly affected or by someone acting on behalf of the person directly affected. Confidential information can be given over the telephone but formal complaints must be in writing.
