






BEASTLY is supported by the Australian Government through the Australian Cultural Diplomacy Grants Program of the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade.

BEASTLY is the first fruit of a growing relationship between learning disabled artists and their supporters in Australia, Malaysia and Indonesia. This collaboration seeks to democratise art further through including work driven by learning disabled artists in international festivals

REASTLY grew from conversations with artists about the animal world, endangered species and their real, mythological and imaginative relationships with animals. These relationships common to all cultures give depth and nuance to how we view nature. This led to artists deciding to transform an ordinary everyday environment into a village, where audiences experience short beastly themed performances which invite desper reflection about how we as human beings relate to the animal world. Audiences are taken on a guided tour of the village, via interactive street art installations, featuring fun and fanciful hybrid beings which prepare them for their experience.
