Intro

Incite Arts and the award-winning stArts with D Performance Ensemble present Strong Feelings, offering powerful immersive and sensory experiences, telling the varied and thought-provoking stories of a group of artists with disability living in Mparntwe/Alice Springs. Strong Feelings shares their unique life journeys through a mixture of portraiture and storytelling; using costume, digital and visual art, song, soundscapes, video and photography.

About stArts with D

stArts with D is a performing arts ensemble engaging artists with disability in programs to build skills, co-create, collaborate and present disability-led performance works. Incite Arts has produced arts and disability programs since 2005, with the stArts with D group forming in 2013. Film

Listen

As a way to introduce the audience to people, place and culture, 'Listen' began as a poem written by the group. It was translated into Auslan offering creative choreographic material for the artists to work with. This developed into a film and is an important reminder that these artists have stories to tell and they will tell them in their own ways.

Song Dress

Lizzie Trew is a young Pitjantjatjara and Arrernte woman whose creativity shines in this film. Initially her idea was to compose a song. The complexities of the sounds and lyrics she created became the force behind her 'Song Dress' as she wanted to 'see' the music. Lizzie designed the dress, and painted the fabric, which matches the rhythm, flow and beats of the music. Alongside some of her animation work, this film showcases how her dress makes her feel. Lizzie is a creative phenomenon.

DJ Brandon Williams

Brandon Williams has always dreamed of being a world-famous DJ. To play a banging tune and for people around the globe to hear it, what an achievement! Well, that is exactly what happened. The song was set free, the people pressed play and the dancing began!! Brandon's epic track forms the backing to this incredible film clip, connecting the rest of the world to the Central Desert through some seriously powerful beats.

Go Back There

Janice Carroll's song 'Go Back There' vocalises her love for her family and desire to return to her country. When hearing the song it was clear to everyone that she needed to return to Pukatja/ Ernabella, for the first time in years. This film captures heart-warming displays of connection to land and people, beautiful scenery and exuberant family members!

Ntaria

Ntaria was created celebrating the country of the awesome artist **Caleb McMillan**. Caleb's deep connection to his family is paramount in this film and his gentle heart and infectious personality envelop all those who meet him. This film offers a window into seeing those deep connections, history and day-to-day life in Ntaria (Hermannsburg). The film has a haunting soundtrack of song created by Caleb, exploring what he loves about his homeland.

These incredible portraits' sole purpose is to communicate the distillation of emotion. The photographs give the artist's feelings a visual voice. It is therefore dreamt that not only will these portraits be seen, they will also be heard...

Moving Portraits

These portraits explore a range of emotions felt by the artists: frustration, joy, anger, contemplation, acceptance, love. They ask the viewer to see them, to notice them, and to listen. Fabian 'Miller' Miller

First Nations artist, Miller, first engaged with Incite Arts programs as a student at Acacia Hill School. Now a stArts with D Ensemble member, he has a strong friendship network



with fellow artists, who share his enthusiasm. Miller loves his participation in all Incite Arts programs and productions. He is featured in the artwork for Strong Feelings.

Isaac Trew

Isaac is a First Nations man who began his involvement in Incite Arts at a very young age. He is a founding member of the stArts with D Ensemble, and



has created feature performances as part of Incite Arts programs and productions over many years. He is currently working on his storytelling and has the ability to turn a room into a dance party at any given moment.

Christopher 'Chris' Day

stArts with D's newest ensemble member, Chris brings a vibrant and thoughtful energy to the group. He is a strong performer and offers a new perspective to dancing in a wheelchair. His creativity is displayed through his movement, film making and portrait work, and his ability to harness and control emotions is outstanding.

Michael 'Mickey' Wallace

Mickey is the last of the founding members of the stArts with D Ensemble. A young First Nations man with buckets of energy, Mickey takes great delight in <u>musical and</u>



movement explorations. He has been a key participant and performer in many Incite Arts programs and productions and has a strong work and friendship ethic.

Brandon Williams

Brandon is a young First Nations man who began his involvement in Incite Arts programs as a child at Acacia Hill School. Brandon's creative input has been shown in



many programs and productions, including the award-winning Close To Me. He has performed as a dancer and musician; his films have been broadcast around the world and he has been part of the Incite production team. This founding member of stArts with D loves listening to music, 'dropping the beat' and supporting his friends.

Joy 'Janice' Carroll

Janice enjoys her engagement in dance and music which gives her a voice, drawing on strengths and insights that reshape her confidence. Janice, a First Nations artist from



Pukatja/Ernabella, is a founding member of the stArts with D Ensemble. She continues to create and perform compelling original solo works as part of Incite Arts programs and productions.
