Its members are representatives from those groups who work towards artistic empowerment and filling the creative needs of people with disabilities - that is ACCESS ARTS, ACCESSIBLE ARTS and ARTS ACCESS to name a few. All the current members attended a meeting in Melbourne in July. They all work with people with disabilities and three have disabilities. The inaugural meeting was held in late 1990.

This group was formed to facilitate and maintain a responsive national overview of the trends in the arts for those experiencing disadvantage or a disability.

The members of DADAA wish to establish a group that is in touch with what is happening in these fields so the collective wisdom of people working with these groups can become a respected cohesive voice in planning and decision making. DADAA believes that people experiencing disabilities or disadvantage contribute positively to the community. Everyone benefits from the vitality of integration.

DADAA wants to act as an advisory body to the government sector and our experience will make Sure that the hard-won arts dollars can be be directed effectively. Experience in project and program design is well represented amongst member groups, who will be much better off if we all are aware of what's going on (and down) across Australia, especially what the funding bodies are up to!

In the current climate of dwindling funds from the government sector there is an urgent need for DADA DADAA to be established. The seeking of public sector funding is paramount. A flexible and responsible 'face' of the groups that we represent will make funding of the arts attractive to business and worthwhile to those we represent.
