EASE can provide information about access and facilities at venues in and around Melbourne.

Method of Payment

Pay at the EASE office or by posting a cheque or money order made out to ARTS ACCESS. Payment is never made at the venue. Please note Items 4 and 7 of the Conditions of Sale.

Conditions of Sale

- 1. Tickets are sold only to EASE subscribers and are not transferable.
- 2. Tickets are sold to staff members of an organisation on the understanding that they are attending an event as a support person for the clients of that organisation, and under no other circumstances.
- 3. There is no exchange or refund of tickets. A booking cannot be cancelled.
- 4. Tickets must be paid for within 14 days.
- 5. EASE will purchase tickets, where possible, to suit a subscriber's particular requirements.
- 6. The EASE quoted price varies from the price printed on tickets because an EASE commission is added to each sale.
- 7. EASE staff reserve the right to cancel or suspend membership if conditions of sale are breached.

EASE 'Action Plan' workshops draw strong support from venue managers

Report: Developing an Action Plan Seminar, Flinders Park, November

Ten venue management staff attended this Seminar, representing managers and staff from Melbourne Cricket Club (which manages the MCG); Scienceworks and the Museum of Victoria; Napier Street Theatre; Arts Access; George Jenkins Theatre, Frankston Cultural Centre and Morris-Walker Consultants.

The seminar gave participants a clearer understanding of the needs of people with disabilities through a panel of people with disabilities talking about their experiences as consumers of the arts and entertainment, and wide ranging discussions as to how venues can introduce physical changes and implement policies to welcome people with disabilities as consumers and colleagues.

A major focus of the day was the implications of the Disability

Discrimination Act (DDA) and how to develop an Action Plan as outlined under the DDA. In the final sessions of the day, participants concentrated on developing Action Plans for their venues to be refined later and constantly updated.

The seminar was a success with most participants describing the day as good to very good. They especially welcomed the chance to meet with people with disabilities and learn from them.

EASE thanks the Flinders Park management for their support in mounting this seminar.

Disability Awareness Seminar Reports

Friday 8 September at The Malthouse & Friday 20 October at Scienceworks

These two seminars were attended by staff from the State Film Theatre, Napier Street Theatre (four staff), ACME Food Co, Village Roadshow, Frankston Cultural Centre (three staff), the Princess Theatre, Melbourne Zoo (three staff), Werribee Zoo (two staff), Healesville Sanctuary, the Jewish Museum of Australia and Scienceworks.

Apart from learning from the personal experiences of the panel of people with disabilities, the participants learned about the implications of the Disability Discrimination Act and the most appropriate strategies for servicing customers with disabilities.

Responses from participants included: "I learned a lot from today's seminar. Thank you for the opportunity to attend.",

"All customer service people should do this course", and

"I loved the chance to talk to the panel, their knowledge and experience was so valuable."

New EASE Venue Guide in progress

As part of the Venue Access Programme, EASE has received sponsorship funding from VicHealth to produce an updated version of the Venue Access Guides.

Originally produced in two parts in 1990 and 1992, the updated edition of the guide will contain comprehensive information on access and facilities at over 80 of Melbourne's major arts, sporting and entertainment venues.

An invaluable resource for people with disabilities, the new *EASE Venue Access Guide* will be published in book form and will be available for purchase from booksellers, disability networks and tourism information outlets in late 1996.

Former EASE Ticketing Coordinator, Lisa McKoy, has taken on the role of Project Officer for the Guide and is currently researching the possible content and format of the book in consultation with EASE members and disability groups. A reference committee has also been established to advise on the project.

EASE is also seeking volunteers who will be able to assist us in assessing venues or entering venue information on computer.

Collection of venue information starts in January 1996. If you can help and are available during business hours please call Lisa McKoy on 9699 8299 on a Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday.

Venue Profile

Flinders Park development

The multimillion dollar Stage Two development at Flinders Park opens on January 15, 1996 with the first round of the Ford Australian Open tennis tournament.

Located on 5.5 hectares of land north of the existing site, the development includes:

- 8 Rebound Ace match courts
- 2 stadium courts (3000 and 1500 seats)
- 1 clay court
- Multi purpose function centre with dining facility for 1500 people
- Garden Square
- A 500 space car park

Facilities for patrons with disabilities are:

- New change rooms, showers and toilets for disabled tennis players which will be ready for the World Team Cup to be held in February 1996.
- Accessible toilets are also located in the public amenities area at Show Court 3 adjacent to the new western courts.
- Both the new show courts have provision for ramped access to seating areas.
- Wheelchair patrons will be able to sit with companions at both courts using individual seats.
- Ramped access is also provided to all new courts, the Function centre and to the new change rooms.

EASE Ramps

EASE has two ramps for hiring out to venues that need to improve their access for particular events.

The ramps are aluminium and measure about 1 metre long.

They are useful for overcoming one or two steps at the most.

Hiring fees:

\$10 per day; \$7 half day; \$ 40 per week, with refundable \$20 deposit.

EASE promotes access issues to tourism and leisure industries

The December issue of *Leisure*, the journal of the Australian Leisure Institute includes a major feature article about EASE, written by Dean Michael.

The article is based on Dean's address to the Ablympics Conference in Perth

EASE aims to further develop its advocacy work to tourist and leisure industry bodies to ensure that awareness of issues such as the Disability Discrimination Act continues to grow outside the immediate entertainment industry.
