About the Tutti Choir and Tutti Inc.

Tutti is Australia's first inclusive choir and takes its name from the musical term 'Tutti'. meaning everyone. From its origins as a small singing group at Minda, the original choir has grown into a vibrant independent multi arts organisation (Tutti Inc), deeply connected into the disability and mainstream arts worlds of South Australia and beyond. With its strong commitment to access and inclusion. Tutti is both a grass roots nurturer of disabled artists and a creator and presenter of high quality work which brings disabled artists, and community and professional artists together for high quality performances and exhibitions. Each week Tutti provides opportunities for over 200 people to participate more fully in the community through the visual and performing arts, new media and filmmaking. Since 2001 Tutti has been internationally recognised as a model of artistic excellence and social inclusion and in 2008 the organisation became a Key Producer with the Australia Council for the Arts. Tutti has won many awards for individual productions and in 2008 won top honours in the National Music in Communities awards for bringing disadvantaged people together through music. The Tutti Choir has now evolved into three choirs, two of which regularly perform around SA and interstate at conference openings, official functions, concerts and festivals. Many members have also performed in Vancouver and Minneapolis, and mentored other inclusive choirs. Since February 2012 the Tutti Choir has been led by its resident director Richard Chew and assistant Laura Ellis. Previous directors include Jonathan Bligh, Phillip Griffin and Tutti's Founder, Pat Rix.

Poco Tutti - Poco (little) Tutti is the name given to our smaller choir of 20 singers comprising soloists and experienced singers from the large Tutti Choir. Poco Tutti was established in 2006 to increase skill levels by offering a more advanced repertoire.

Hot Tutti Tutti performing artists Aimee Crathern, Annika Hooper, Caroline Hardy and Michelle Hall came together as a quartet in 2011 to arrange and sing the songs they've written and the songs they love. The group has secured funding to record their first album later this year. Their motto? 'No-one can 'dis' our ability!'

Richard Chew - Music Director Richard is a composer, conductor and educator whose works include operas, several large-scale works for orchestra and chorus for the English National Opera, Welsh National Opera and many others. His work also includes music for theatre and film and he has devised several new works for children and people with disability. Richard's music has been performed and broadcast widely in the UK, Europe, Australia and the USA. Recent productions include *The Velvet Gentleman*, (2012 Adelaide Cabaret Festival), *Instructions for an Imaginary Man* (2012 Adelaide Festival), *The Magic Flute*, (2011 Tutti & State Opera), and *Stari Most*,(2011 Come Out Festival). Richard is Musical Director for Various People Inc and a lecturer in Music at UniSA.

Laura Ellis - Assistant Music Director, Conductor Laura Ellis is an Adelaide based singer/songwriter and accomplished performer with nearly ten years experience performing original works. Laura currently teaches piano at various Adelaide Hills Primary Schools, is the Conductor of Poco Tutti Choir and Assistant to Richard with the Tutti Choir.

Working Dog Union - Working Dog Union is an Adelaide-based Celtic fusion band featuring a stunning mix of uilleann pipes, whistles, keyboards and drums, which is currently taking the traditional music world by storm.
