It includes some very funny skits, such as "The Royal Family" and "A Day in the Life of Angels". The show also introduces audiences to "sign singing" with songs like "Blue Bayou" and "The Best Things In Life Are Free". It is a cabaret style show with broad appeal.

Available for functions, benefits, launches, dinner theatre evenings...you name it! **CASTLES IN THE AIR** is the perfect fundraiser for your organisation. All you have to do is organise the venue, publicity, tickets and function requirements.

**CASTLES IN THE AIR** is 1 1/2 hour long and can be divided into two 45 minutes sections, eg. before and after dinner, if you prefer. There are no special requirements for staging, except that the performance area will have to be 5 metres by 5 metres and adequately lit. The performers will need to have access to the venue during the afternoon for rehearsing and setting up.

The fee for **CASTLES IN THE AIR** is \$500.00. Why not get your group together, "buy" a performance and put on a special night as a fundraiser. You can charge what you like for tickets and make some money for your organisation.
