body suits

A national touring exhibition produced by Arts Access

A compelling exhibition that will challenge our perceptions, Body Suits, commences it's national tour Sat 5 July at 200 Gertrude St Fitzroy. The Hon. Senator Richard Alston, Minister for Communication and the Arts, will open the exhibition at 3pm on the same day.

Body Suits addresses presumptions as to what constitutes a normal body in our culture through the work of nine contemporary Australian artists: Ross Barber. Susan Norrie, Ed Burton, Cecilia Clarke, Colin Duncan, Mikala Dwyer, Ruark Lewis, Bronwyn Platten and Jane Trengove.

The exhibition links works by artists with and without disabilities

through the unifying theme of the body.

The relationship between mind & body, the power and authority invested in the senses and the symbolic language relating to body parts will be explored.

The title *Body Suits* refers to how we are coded through the primary sense of sight. Visually a person is seen and evaluated unconsciously. Any 'difference' may be found confronting.

Exhibition curator and artist Jane Trengove, explains: "The exhibition incorporates a diversity of approaches to body imaging."

Queensland artist Ross Barber has removed 'the body' and replaced it with a delicate sound work. His installation refers to his physical status highlighting the absence of the muscled body by its replacement with an intensely active mind.

Jane Trengove binds a model of her leg brace in wool making connections with the unconscious free will of movement and entrapment, overprotection and smothering goodwill.

JANE TRENGOVE
Curator of Body Suits

Jane Trengove is a practising visual artist and arts worker. She has exhibited within Australia in a number of solo and group exhibitions such as *Souvenir* 1995, *Colonial Post Colonial* 1996, *Juice* 1997 and is currently represented by Irene Sutton Gallery in Fitzroy.

As a small child, Jane was probably one of the last people to contract the polio virus in the 1950's Victorian epidemics. This caused a mobility disability as she was affected in all limbs. The experience of living with a disability led Jane to an interest in the Arts Access organisation and a desire to work for the rights of people with disabilities.

Jane first worked with Arts Access in 1991 on a committee for the *Participate* project.

Since then Jane has worked on a number of different contracts with Arts Access. These include Studio co-ordinator, Saturday Morning Art Class Tutor, Master-Classes Co-ordinator and Curator for *Body Suits* national touring exhibition.

Art Day

Art Day South and West are two visual and performing arts projects which run throughout the year for adults with an intellectual disability. Both projects are currently constructing performance works to be staged later this year.

Art Day South will present a performance / visual art installation work, utilising sound, music, action, video and 3D images in September. "Scoring Expeditions" will create movement scenes which interact, provoke and respond to a shifting, evolving environment - the performance space.

Art Day West will perform a musical extravaganza in November - "Who Done It". This self devised theatre work will involve dance, music and outrageous costumes. A ballroom dancer is murdered! Bob and Alison search for clues, a colourful murder mystery experience.




Question 1.


