

The Tutti Choir is an inclusive community choir of over seventy singers which began in 1983 under the direction of Pat Fox. Renowned for its friendliness and passion, Tutti has always been about building bridges and welcomes and respects all peoples. Now a Key Producer with the Australia Council, Tutti is internationally acknowledged as a model of artistic excellence and social inclusion and in 2008 won the Music Council of Australia's Inclusive Music in Communities Award for enabling marginalised people of all ages to participate in a broad range of high quality performances.

Tutti's concert at St John's Church features four long-time members of Tutti in solo vocal roles.

Brenton Shaw has been involved with Tutti since 2002 and is currently accompanying year twelve at Immanuel College where he is an active participant in choral and dramatic ensemble work. He first sang with Tutti as a child soloist in Tutti's acclaimed 2002 Adelaide Festival show *My Life, My Love* and earlier this year performed in Tutti's Australian premiere of Orlando Gough and Richard Chew's opera *The Shouting Face*. Brenton intends to make his career in music and theatre.

Annikka Hooper joined the Tutti Choir in 2004. Since then her pure voice has captivated audiences at many major South Australian events including Adelaide Fringe by Candlelight and the 2005, 2007 and 2009 Bonfire Forest Weekends. Annika has performed as a soloist in Tutti's award-winning Numbers Lyrical Southern Cross (2007), *Blood Debt* (2008), *Curlew* (2008) and *The Shouting Face* (2009). In 2007 she recorded her own CD *Soloing Here*.

Marilyn Edwards and Bob Canast are long term members of the Tutti Choir and represent the mature part of the Tutti community that is truly the heart of the organisation. Both Marilyn and Bob bring tremendous life-experience and a deep love of music to their performances and their contribution to the life of Tutti is significant.


