# Launch of the Second Edition of the Melbourne Venue Guide

EASE-Entertainment Access Service, and the Access and Mobility Committee of the Victorian Division of ACROD were proud to launch the second edition of the Melbourne Venue Guide recently.

The Guide was launched at the Victorian Arts Centre-George Fairfax Studio foyer on Thursday 20th February 1992 by the Minister for Community Services-Kay Setches.

The aim of the Guide is to assist people with disabilities to attend any entertainment event of their choice, forearmed with information on access and facilities, thereby enabling them to enjoy the experience with dignity and the minimum of fuss.

The first edition of the Melbourne Venue Guide was launched in June 1990 and received overwhelming support from people with disabilities, their friends, families and support workers who found it provided essential information to ensure that they were well aware of what to expect at their entertainment destinations in Melbourne.

The demand for more information grew and the second edition of the Guide was placed on the drawing board in mid 1991.

This new Guide provides information on access and facilities at 16 venues not included in the first edition. Two regional venues have been included as well as some of the major cinemas in Melbourne. There is also updated information on some of the venues included in the first edition as well as expanded information on booking procedures and services.

Information on bookings, telephone numbers for assistance, seating plans, notes on parking, arrangements that need to be made with the venue prior to attending has all been included along with specific information relating to each venue.

The launch was well attended by consumers, service providers, the entertainment industry and interested individuals and was deemed a great success. Thank you to everyone who attended on the day for your support and encouragement. It was great to finally meet so many people face to face after all this time talking on the phone.

### Dear EASE members

As many of you are aware. EASE is managed and run by Arts Access as a part of its commitment to creating opportunities in the arts with people with disabilities or who are disadvantaged.

The demand for accessible entertainment by people with disabilities/disadvantage is enormous. In the four years EASE has been operating, it has grown from its original distribution of 3,000 tickets to more than 12,000 in 1991. Ticket distribution in 1992 will go even higher.

As EASE has had no increase in funding or in staff, this increase in tickets has meant a buge increase in work for all the EASE staff and volunteers.

Over the last few months, some of you who use EASE have remarked on a change in the level of service, saying that staff have not been able to spend as much time on the phone with you discussing your entertainment requirements, or that your tickets have taken a few days longer to reach

These changes are the result of a buge increase in people using the service. EASE is committed to continuing to provide accessible, affordable entertainment opportunities for as many people as possible. Your help and understanding when using EASE, will ensure that the level of service remains as high as possible.

The more information you have prior to ringing EASE (such as the name or type of show you would like to see, when you would like to see it etc), the more easily the EASE staff can deal with your request. Included in this Newsletter is a flier that explains the many ways you can find out what's on.

I hope you all continue to be a part of Melbourne's entertainment audiences and encourage you to write to us if you have any particularly good (or bad!) experiences. Regards

Access Information: We also provide information about access and facilities at venues in and around Melbourne-over the phone, in the Newsletter and via the Melbourne Venue Guide - Editions 1 and 2.

How to book with EASE: To book tickets with EASE, phone 699 8497 and discuss with Lisa what's on, what you would like to see and any special requirements.

Free or Cheap Tickets: EASE keeps a list of people who are interested in free or cheap tickets which are usually available at short notice. If you can avail yourself of this service please call Lisa and join

Ticket Requests: EASE will negotiate for tickets to any event at your request. Your name will be placed on a waiting list and EASE will contact you should we be successful. Sometimes we do not receive an allocation until a few days before the event so if you really want tickets for a particular concert and can afford to pay full price, it is best to book with BASS. EASE will assist with full price tickets only if you have special seating requirements.

Exchange and Refund Policy: There is NO exchange or refund on tickets booked with EASE so please be certain of your requirements and the number of tickets before you make a booking. Both BASS and VISA have a **NO REFUND**. NO EXCHANGE policy.

Method of Payment: Payment can be made at the EASE office or by posting a cheque or money order made out to ARTS ACCESS. Payment is never made at the venue as EASE pays for all tickets at the time of booking. Prompt payment for tickets is essential. Tickets must be paid for within two weeks of receiving your tickets and invoice. Please enclose complete invoice or details with your payment otherwise it is difficult to match up cheques with bookings.

Please remember that a booking is a financial commitment and that EASE must pay for all tickets at the time of booking in order to get you the best seats or the seats you need. If your payment is delayed it means that we cannot continue to make bookings and it puts the service in jeopardy for everyone.

# The EASE Service-An Update

EASE negotiates with promoters for discounted tickets and the right to make individual bookings to suit individual requirements. Most promoters give us access to any seats in the theatre. However sometimes we only get a limited allocation of tickets and by the time EASE bookings open the shows are often heavily sold. Promoters are under no obligation to discount tickets and their support for the EASE scheme makes it possible for many people to attend shows who could not previously do so.

If you have a visual impairment, mobility difficulties or need a wheelchair space for an event, EASE can often assist with booking appropriate seats for events that EASE does not have discount tickets for. In this case you would have to pay full price plus a small booking fee. For some events seats are now being held for such purposes and these seats may not be able to be accessed through BASS.

If you can afford to pay full price it is wise to take note from the newspapers or radio when tickets go on sale and to contact EASE in advance or to buy your tickets through BASS or the venue the day the show goes on sale.
