The Talent

The Tutti Choir is Australia's first inclusive choir and takes its name from the musical term 'Tutti', meaning everyone. From its origins in 1997 as a small singing group at Minda, the choir has grown into a vibrant independent multi arts organisation, deeply connected into the disability and mainstream arts worlds of South Australia and beyond. With its strong commitment to access and inclusion, Tutti is both a grass roots nurturer of disabled artists and a creator and presenter of high quality work which brings disabled artists, and community and professional artists together for performances and exhibitions.

The Gathering Wave Cheir is an initiative of ink Pot Arts in Mi Barker, and now in its eighth year offers the opportunity for people of any age and ability to enjoy singing in an open friendly environment. The Gathering Wave has had a strong affiliation with Tutti since 2009 and has been led by Pat Rix since 2012. This year the choir wave has performed at lnk Pot Arts Winter Solstice Showcase. The Adelaide Hills Farmers Market, Syd and Molly Lewis's has performed at the Charleston Town Hall and most recently during the interval of the theatre work *from Footprint* 80°° birthday at the Charleston Town Hall and most recently during the interval of the theatre work *from Footprint* to *footplote*, ink Pot Arts' theatre work commemorating Mt Barker's 175°° birthday. The choir has 20 members 12 of whom are with us tolday.

The Klematg Signing Choir are from Klematig Primary School. The school and the Centre for Hearing impaired are totally integrated to provide a bilingual/bicultural program where Deaf/hearing impaired and hearing students learn in Auslan (Australian Sign Language) and English. The Auslan Early Learning Program provides a preschool program for Deaf and hearing impaired children as well as children with Deaf parents or siblings.

Club Tutti began in 2003 and this year with support from the Holdfast Bay Council has offered Club T2, a second smaller group for beginners. Club Tutti is led by long time Tutti singer Jayne Hewetson and offers people with high support needs the opportunity to sing in an open friendly environment which builds personal confidence and a social network for participants.

TKY (Tutti Kids and Youth program) began in 2007 and is Adelaide's only out of school hours arts program specifically for children and youth living with disability. Led by specialist arts educators, TKY classes are once a week and offer small group activities in music, drama and movement. Today's performance is by young people from the two older groups who have combined with their tutors Michael Ross and Annie Siegmann to bring you an original song written especially for the concert.

Brenton Shaw. Brenton has performed in musical theatre, cabaret, opera, choral works, and theatre. His stage credits include Les Miserables (2001, 2002, and 2013), Bool (2010), and Eye Music (2014). Alongside performance Brenton has worked as a composer/writer and collaborated on original shows fire and Breath (2011) and Everybody Does Love Songs (2012).

He was Musical Director for the Australian premiere of Peter Pon: A Musical Adventure with the Adelaide Youth Theatre (2012). In 2013 he was fortunate enough to receive an independent Arts Foundation grant, which assisted with his student exchange to Minnesota State University, USA. In 2014 Brenton completed his BA of Arts Honours in music composition, where he adapted Bryce Courtenay's novel Jessice for the musical theatre stage. Brenton has been a long time member of Tutti, since his debut in My Life, My Love (2001-2002), and feels extremely humbled to conduct a choir that he so dearly loves.

Richard Chew. Since arriving from the UK in 2008 Bichard's work has featured in the Adelaide Festival of the Arts, Adelaide Fringe Festival and Adelaide Cabaret Festival. His oratorio *Stori Most* featured as the official closing event for the 2011 Come Out Festival, Richard has received commissions from the Vienna Festival. South Bank Centre, London, Three Choirs Festival, Amsterdam Biennale, Festival of Arts and Ideas Connecticut USA and his music for the Young Vic Theatre Company's *Sleeping Beauty* played at the Barbican in London before transferring to Broadway. Career highlights include two operas for young people commissioned by Welsh National Opera, the premiere of *Stori Most* at Salisbury Cathedral and singing the role of *Arion* in Alec Roth's *Arion and the Dolphin* for English National Opera with libretto by Vikram Seth. Richard's ballad opera Mary Seacole was premiered at the hoyal Opera House, Covent Garden and he has also worked with leading British orchestras including the LSO and orchestra of Welsh National Opera, which he conducted in the premiere of his choral work *The Most Beautiful Mari from the Sea* at the Welsh Millenium Centre, Cardiff (libretto by National Poet of Wales, Gwyneth Lewis). Richard lectores in Music and Drama at the University of South Australia and is a popular presenter for the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra. Earlier this year, Richard conducted the premiere of his community opera *The Six Swans* at Leiston Abbey in Suffolk for commissioning company, the UK-based Wonderful Beast. Tutti will partner with Richard and UniSA for the Australian premiere of *The Six Swans* in June 2015.
