

Public Transport

The Town Hall is two blocks from Flinders Street Station. All gutters have dropped kerbs. Unfortunately the dropped kerbs on Flinders Street, outside the station, are not directly opposite each other. This means that people using wheelchairs or frames need to cut across the pedestrian flow.

Tram

Any tram down Swanston Street or Collins Street would be suitable (if accessible).

Parking

All parking is metered.

Accessible Parking

1. No parking in the Town Hall although it is possible to drop off. See "Entrances 2" below.

EASE has introduced an organisation service fee and a newsletter subscription. The support we have received from organisations and individuals has been enormous. And now with the added assistance of the Ministry for the Arts we are looking forward to an exciting future.

During 1990 we have plans to dramatically increase the number of tickets available and distributed through the scheme. We hope to maintain our level of service and make the experience of going out as enjoyable as possible. Be prepared for the calls about tickets on short notice. During the year we will continue to publish information on venue access in our newsletter.

- 2. One parking spot on the south side of Little Collins Street near the corner with Swanston Street.
- 3. Melbourne City Council can arrange, for a fee, reserved parking in the area for buses. Ring: 663 5871

Entrances

- 1. Main Door on Swanston Street, many steps with rails. There are a couple of steps up to the outer portico without rails.
- 2. For those using wheelchairs or unable to negotiate the front steps it is possible to use the inner lift, through the car park beneath the Town Hall. Take the lane off Swanston Street and through the middle of the building, past the boom gate and around the corner with a large mirror assisting drivers. Continue until you come to a revolving platform on the ground (for turning cars) and turn right. There is a continued next page

sharp incline into the next room. The lifts are through the door to the left. Take the lift to the first floor. This avenue can also be used if you need to be dropped off, although you cannot park under the Hall.

The Town Hall would prefer to have prior notification if you intend using this entrance. Ring Rick Bunting, Hall Manager on 658 9780, the gate attendant will be warned and staff will provide assistance.

3. For large groups using wheelchairs the entrance detailed above may be too confined-vehicle movement under the hall is restricted and the lifts are small. There is a portable ramp for the three steps up to the rear door on the Collins Street side. This ramp is not suitable for walking frames or sticks. Ring Rick Bunting on 658 9780 to arrange for use of this ramp.

Seating

- 1. On the floor: All seating on the Town Hall floor is movable, but still numbered. When notified of a wheelchair booking Hall staff remove a block of at least four seats and replace with individual seats. This is quite flexible and gives people a choice of seating.
- 2. Balcony seating: tiered with rails down some aisles. Rails on steps from lifts to balcony. Balcony seating is at present inaccessible, however, there are plans to introduce ramps and suitable seating areas.

Toilets

Toilets are to either side of the Main Swanston Street Foyer. The "Gents" towards Collins Street, the "Ladies" towards Little Collins Street. These toilets are not accessible.

Accessible Toilets

Collins Street Foyer, Western end. Outer doors slide and are not heavy. There is a large toilet cubicle but the door is awkward to close.

Phone

Only one public phone in the building (due to continual vandalism). Take the lift to the ground floor and turn left, away from the car park. This phone is at present too high for wheelchair users.

LOWER TOWN HALL

Seating Capacity: 350 Wheelchair Capacity: Flexible, however see notes on entrances

Public Transport and Parking As for Main Hall.

Entrances

- 1. Off Swanston Street, under the Portico. Steps under the Portico, into the Foyer and from the area known as the Crush Space into the Hall!
- 2. Wheelchair users or people unable to negotiate steps can use the Goods Lift from the central lane. Ask the gate keeper for assistance. On the day we visited the Hall this lift did not work. It is not an attractive entrance, however there are plans for extensive renovations of the Lower Hall and a new lift is to be installed.

Seating

Floor is flat with movable seating.

Toilets

Along the corridor off the Foyer. Steps. Accessible Toilets

At present the closest accessible toilet is off the Collins Street Foyer via the Main Hall. A major trek, up the goods lift, round through the car park, up the lift

and through the Main Hall.

Phone

At the end of the Corridor leading away from the Foyer. This is not accessible for wheelchair users. Don't forget that the Foyer cannot be accessed by wheelchair users from the Lower Hall.

Helpful Hints

- 1. If you have any questions about access ring Rick Bunting on 658 9780, and he or his staff will be able to assist.
- 2. Signs are not clear, you may have to request staff assistance.

The Melbourne City Council have plans to make their venues more accessible. When this takes place many of the points made above will no longer apply.

Amendments-National Gallery of Victoria

The Gallery would like us to include some amendments to our review of access to their building and facilities in our last newsletter.

Admission Fees: Adults \$1.30 ea; Children 65 cents ea; family groups (i.e. 1 adult and up to 6 children, or 2 adults and up to 5 children) \$2.60; Season tickets: yearly \$10.60; half yearly \$5.30. Pensioners and the unemployed can gain free entry on presentation of appropriate identification.

Accessible Parking:

Parking on the Gallery Forecourt can also be booked with the Information Desk after 10.00am. Ring 618 0222.

Ticket Office:

Staff will assist people who cannot reach the counter by accepting entrance fees at the information desk.

Telephones:

There are three telephones in the building. Only local calls can be made on the accessible phone (Red Phone) in the Main Foyer.

Wheelchair Hire:

Three wheelchairs (not four) are available for use within the Gallery at no cost. It is advisable to book these with the Information Desk Staff before arriving. This is especially important for the big exhibitions. Ring 618 0222 and ask for the Information Desk, after 10.00am.
