

From the Writers / Directors

The first stage of Between the Worlds in May 2004 was called Circles and was about relationships with significant people in our lives.

The second stage development this year involved interviewing all our actors to explore deeper relationship themes. One of these interviews was with our talented male lead. Alistair Brasted who said: "I've always felt between the worlds, not knowing where I really belong". This insight resonated with all our artists and became the theme of the whole script because they had all experienced feelings of exclusion. The story of Romeo and Juliet and their love which transcends hate and divisiveness served as inspiration for Between the Worlds. In our story the innocence of Isabella and Oliver's love in the face of adversity has allowed us to explore universal questions of discrimination and difference which lie at the heart of violence. Such stories have been with us since the beginning of time. Like the script, the songs and music for Between the Worlds are the expression of the individual voices of our actors.

We would like to express our thanks to Arts SA, the Australia Council for the Arts CCDB and Minda Inc for making this unique international collaboration possible. We also thank Festivals Australia for making it possible to present Between the Worlds at the 10th Awakenings Festival in Horsham Victoria.

We feel that this project furthers our artistic vision: At Tutti people who were never heard find their voice, and people who were invisible create work of extraordinary beauty. We believe that for those who hear the stories of our performers, feelings for the human experience are forever changed.

We hope you enjoy our 'differently different' love story, Pat and Jeanne.

Jeanne Calvit is Artistic Director of Interact Center for the Visual and Performing Arts. Minneapolis. She is a pioneer in the field of theatre and disability in the US and has been creating theatre with actors with and without disabilities for the past 25 years. Jeanne founded Interact in 1991 and now with a clientele of 100 artists, Interact is the only arts centre in the US involving artists with a wide range of disabilities in the creation of professional high quality theatre and visual arts on a daily basis. All artists are paid for their work.

Pat Rix is Artistic Director of the Tutti Ensemble. A playwright and composer with experience in both community and mainstream theatre, she began what has become SA's acclaimed Tutti Ensemble in 1997. Tutti is an inclusive arts organization embodying an integrated approach to performing arts and choral training whose achievements have enabled hundreds of people marginalised through disability to participate in high quality arts events. Inspired by Jeanne's achievements with Interact, in October 2004 Pat and the Tutti Board in partnership with Minda Inc. pioneered Tutti Arts, the first performing and visual arts centre for artists with a disability in Australia. Supported by members of the Tutti Choir, this is their first performance.
