Hi. My name is Roland Cox. Many of you will have seen me over the past month or so coming into Minda Inc. to help Pat and take part in the Holdfast Bay Community Choir. I was a member of the Australian Ballet from 1994 - 1998 and I spent those years touring Nationally and Internationally with the company. In 1997 I won a scholarship to study music and dance in Ghana, which is a financially poor but culturally rich country in West Africa. On my return, the Australian Ballet commissioned me to write the music for a ballet which was performed by the company last year.

Pat Rix read a newspaper article about that ballet and contacted me to see if I would be interested in working with the Holdfast Bay Community Choir. We communicated with each other for 9 months solely by e-mail. At first I didn't even know if she was a man or a woman, finally we met each other in April when I came to Adelaide to work with Leigh Warren and dancers.

While Pat is overseas, she has asked me to develop rhythm and movement skills for members of the choir. I am delighted to work with the choir and look forward to having heaps more FUN!!

Kathy Kelly now residing in Melbourne would also be joining us. On Thursday morning 8th April we enjoyed the honour of being the opening performance for the NICAN conference held at the Hilton on the Park. Before this performance we rehearsed very hard because we knew we were representing the whole choir and we were missing the voices of all the other members. As it turned out we had lots of time to rehearse because things were running a little behind schedule. We chose three songs for the performance, 'Good Company' by Andy Leach, 'The floating zoo' with music by Mozart and words by Judith Harris. The third song we chose was 'Kil le -le'.

That afternoon we had our workshop and everyone turned up to help. I talked about the choir and we played some of our recordings. People asked many questions about how we work and everyone from the choir contributed to answering the questions. I have since received emails telling me how inspirational we were and how two new choirs are starting up - one in Bendigo and one in Wagga.

On the last day of the conference we sang at the closing ceremony where everyone heard that the NICAN conference would be held here in Adelaide to coincide with High Beam 2000. We invited all the people who had attended the workshop to sing with us on the stage to sing the 'High Beam Rap'. All the new singers were rather nervous but thanks to the choir members who were on stage holding it all together we managed to sing a rousing version of the 'High Beam Rap'. Even though we were short a couple of our singers (because of bad luck and tiredness) we sang really well and people loved it.

Congratulations to all those who made the journey and participated in the performances and workshops. Thank you also to our sponsors SPARC, NICAN and Minda Incorporated for supporting our involvement in the conference. Together we did a fantastic job and it is wonderful to think that we are inspiring people all over the country to begin their own choir. It was an overwhelmingly good experience.
