EASE Industry Development Program recognised in first Arts 21 Leadership Fund grants

Arts Access has received funding for EASE to present training programs that increase arts industry awareness of best management practices and planning requirements in relation to disability issues.

The announcement, on July 11, at the launch of the inaugural Arts Victoria, Arts 21 Leadership Fund awards, gives recognition to the need for greater disability awareness within Victoria's cultural industries and the benefits good access policies bring to arts venues and promoters.

EASE Program Manager, Dean Michael says the Leadership Fund is a welcome and timely initiative.

"With the advent of the Disability Discrimination Act, EASE is providing a valuable training and consultancy service to assist the entertainment industry to meet new legal obligations."

"The funding will enable EASE to present six metropolitan and two regional training seminars for venue

EASE is currently presenting two seminars - the Disability Awareness Seminar aimed at front-of-house, ticketing and bar/cafe staff, and Developing an Action Plan, which is aimed at management staff who wish to develop strategies to introduce better access polices for their venues.

EASE Ramps

EASE has two ramps for hiring out to venues that need to improve their access for particular events.

The ramps are aluminium and measure about 1 metre long. They are useful for overcoming one or two steps at the most.

EASE Disabilty Awareness Seminar

The first Disability Awareness Seminar was held on Thursday 6 July at St Martins Theatre. This was well attended by twenty-two staff from: the Victorian Arts Centre, The Princess Theatre, The Sidney Myer Music Bowl, Olympic Park, The Sandybeach Centre, The Malthouse, The Alexander Theatre, Circus Oz, St Martin's Theatre, Flinders Park, Save Time Services and the East Gippsland Arts and Recreation Access Group.

The seminar broadens people's understanding of what disability means; discusses the Disability Discrimination Act in detail and its implications; and covers strategies of how to best service the customer with a disability.

Comments from those attending included "Very instructive and informative" and "Bloody brilliant".

EASE will continue these for the rest of the year, and is planning to present a regional seminar later in the year.

Abilympians will hear of EASE success

Venue Profile

Access and looping improvements at the Kino Cinema

According to many EASE members, the access to many Melbourne cinemas ranges from just all right, to terrible. So it's good to see that some cinemas are looking at access and making some improvements.

The Kino Cinema at 45 Collins Street, Melbourne, has wheelchair access to all its cinemas, has ramps to the box office and will have audio loops in place in early September.

There is wheelchair access in the newest of the cinemas - Cinema 3, in the back row. However, as there two rows with no steps in this cinema people can also transfer from their chairs. In the other two cinemas, which have steps, seats can be taken out of the back row. It is possible to accommodate two to three wheelchairs in these areas. Kino staff prefer that patrons notify them first thing in the morning if people in wheelchairs are attending.

For people in wheelchairs or with mobility difficulties, ramps provide the main access to the cinemas from the shopping plaza at the Exhibition Street level. One large ramp leads down from the shopping plaza to the bar and eating level. Then there are two ramps from this area down to the box office.

Some feedback suggests that the first ramp down is quite steep. It is worthwhile ringing the cinemas to ask about the gradient of these ramps.

Audio loops are in place in all the cinemas and cover all the seats. Loops in Cinemas 1 and 2 will be operational in early September. The audio loop in Cinema 3 is now fully operational.

The accessible toilet is found via the ramps at the back of the chemist shop. While there are possibly still some

difficulties when attending the Kino Cinemas, access has visibly improved in some areas and further plans are being considered.

Obviously it is important for all venues to publicise their access features as much as possible and EASE will continue to update you on access information as it comes to hand.
