A new year, a new creative opportunity

Welcome to 2009 and the new look Tutti newsletter where we remember the highlights of 2008 and alert you to two exciting events coming up in the near future. The official launch of Tutti Kids in partnership with Novita Childrens Services by the Honourable Jennifer Rankine, Minister for Disability, is on February 14th at the Odeon Theatre. In March Tutti presents the Australian premiere of Richard Chew and Orlando Gough's radical community opera The Shouting Fence at the State Opera Studio for the Adelaide International Fringe Festival.

Adolescence is an intense time of growth and transition and as Tutti leaps into its twelfth year and Tutti Arts into its fifth, having a newsletter which reflects our expanded world-view to members, friends, sponsors, partners and colleagues is timely and exciting.

December 2008 marks our first year as a Key Producer with the Australia Council and as national winner of the inaugural Australian Music in Communities Awards. Both are great achievements and with over 220 music organisations nominated for the awards, it's no wonder both Jonathon Welch and

Hon. Peter Garret sang our praises.

It means that our brand of social inclusion is working, that cultural constructs about disability are shifting, and that Tutti is opening doors to a new world of possibilities for everyone in the community. It is also great to know, that through our contribution to the national Arts and Disability strategy we are doing our bit to change public perceptions about disability and encourage debate about public policy and law.

2008 saw several excellent high profile interstate performances by our singers, and Tutti's visual artists collectively presented their fabulous and colourful Mosaic Clouds Exhibition at Pepper St Studios: Since then, in SALA and other events, several individuals have exhibited and sold work at Marie Hart's Gallery Glenelg, Hedgerow Flowers Fullarton and AARTBOX in Sydney.

In July, Tutti Kids made a sensational debut at Mission Ignition, the World Youth Day concert at Adelaide Entertainment Centre which also brought Tutti, St Bakhita and the Big Country Choir together on stage for the Sing for Life project. The animation and film work produced by Digitech artists was enthusiastically received at the ARATA Conference in September and in October, Blind Date attracted significant attention at Australian Regional Art at the Heart Conference in Alice Springs, and has been booked for an Adelaide Metropolitan tour in March 2009 and a Northern Territory tour in 2010.

It was a real experience being away with four blind singers in Alice and then Victoria for the Awakenings Festival. They helped me see, feel, touch and taste the world in a very different way

and I learned things about rubber and cactus that most sighted people might never know. I also never would have believed that you could re-write an entire show between Bordertown and Horsham, But then, as everyone keeps reminding me 'Anything is Possible!

Hearty congratulations to Annika Hooper, Brenton Shaw, Aimee Crathern, Emma Taylor, Jayne Hewetson and Michele Thredgold for a stunning standing ovation performance with Jonathon Welch and Kevin Cameron and the Unley Concert Band for the Australia Day Luncheon at the Adelaide Town Hall on Jan 23rd. It was breathtaking.

Tutti Visual Arts has been quietly busy over the last few months. After our major exhibition Mosaic Clouds and our Open Studio for SALA, as well as some of our artists being involved in independent exhibitions, we have been diligently working away in preparation for shows in 2009.



Our Artists have had individual success in several exhibitions in the latter part of 2008. Charlie Taplin exhibited a painting, Stripes 2 in October as part of Accessible Arts' AART BOXX show at the Tin Sheds Gallery in Sydney.

Aimee Crathern won the Under 26 Young Artists Award at the Arts Access A Frame 2008 exhibition, held in the Adelaide Festival Centre in November. James takes us on the inside of his family's trip to India to collect James' new brother Kushal from an orphanage in Pune. The quality of the storytelling is magical and we hope to submit it to short film festivals and eventually try for a broadcast screening.

Tutti began the year with an outstanding performance by Annika Hooper, Aimee Crathern, Brenton Shaw, Emma Taylor, Jayne Hewetson and Michele Thredgold with Jonathon Welch and the Unley Concert Band for the 2009 Australia Day Lunch (Jan 23rd) at the Adelaide Town Hall where they received a standing ovation.

performing arts

A new appointment for Tutti Performing Arts is co-ordinator Juha Vanhakartano. Juha brings a deep knowledge of movement and physical theatre to his role at Tutti and first up introduced a fitness and stamina program for the artists. Our work for the next year will focus

on encouraging a self generation of ideas from the artists themselves with interaction between movement and voice - 'exploring myself in my world'







Tutti Performing Arts will also be involved in a training film project for Minda's new training centre.

It has also been a busy time for our Tutti Choir members Annika Hooper, Emma Taylor and Jason Crowhurst who together with partially sighted blues musician Chris Finnen and non-sighted singer-songwriter Michele Thredgold make up the cast of Blind Date, an original eye-opening cabaret which premiered at the Adelaide Fringe 2008. With a standout performance at Art at the Heart in Alice Springs as well as a successful show at Awakenings in Horsham, Victoria, in 2009 Blind Date is set to take Adelaide by storm with a matinee season of a new show Out of the Square.

club tutti

Club Tutti formed five years ago as a choir for people who want to sing but can't perform or don't want to perform in front of an audience. Club Tutti also acts as a training ground for those wanting to join the Tutti Choir - to get the feel of the choir and what it might be like to become a member.

Our repertoire is varied and wide, from folk songs to gospel to contemporary African. The choir has proudly sung The Beatles' Yellow Submarine every week for the last five years as well as Sun Arise by Rolf Harris as repetition is a good basis for choir activities. The choir size can vary each week with a core group of 15 members; a combination of Minda residents, community members and volunteer support workers. Grant, our piano accompanist, has brought along a work colleague and one of his friends to join the choir which proves the power of word of mouth. Tutti's forthcoming Australian premiere of The Shouting Fence — Don't miss this divine cantata for youth and community choirs and professional singers at the State Opera Studio Netley from March 19th – 28th.

Written by Richard Chew and Orlando Gough, this work was premiered at the South Bank in London in 1994, and has been performed many times since throughout the UK and the Netherlands. The Shouting Fence is the story of a village in the Golan Heights divided by a stretch of noman's-land during the 1967 Arab-Israeli war, and where the separated occupants shout news to each other across the divide each Friday with the aid of megaphones. In this compelling alternately despairing and joyful work Tutti brings together singers from the Tutti and the Adelaide Harmony Choirs with refugee singers from many African countries and the Big Country Choir to highlight our human needs for communication and mutual love. There are only eight performances so book early.
