PUBLIC SEATING

Entries are all at ground level leading into a middle transverse aisle, between terrace and grandstand seating, known as the concourse. Grandstand seating is covered; concourse and terrace seating are uncovered. There are steps to all seating from the concourse.

Wheelchair Access & Seating (Public)

The ground level entry, via gates at Entrance F behind "disabled" car parking area, brings you to the midlevel transverse aisle, known as the concourse. Paths are concreted, except for a small gravelled area behind gate and toilets. Wheelchair users and their friends are restricted to the concourse which is uncovered. Viewing is good. **Toilets**

Toilets close to Entrance F have access cubicles.

Food

There are a number of snack bars and mobile food sellers.

MUSEUM OF VICTORIA - AMENDMENTS

The Museum of Victoria would like us to note some amendments to last edition's Venue Notes.

GOLD OF THE PHARAOHS (closes on the 11 th June): The exhibition is open between 10am and 7pm although last entry is 6pm. The quiet time for visitors is after 2pm weekdavs.

"DISABLED" PARKING: There are two parking spaces for disabled motorists in La Trobe Street.

TELEPHONE: A public telephone, accessible for wheelchair users, is located on Swanston Street near Little Lonsdale Street.

FURTHER CONTACT POINT: If you are unable to contact the Community Services Department in the Museum (669 9997), John Mansfield, Public Relations Officer, is willing to give whatever assistance he can. Ring John on 669 9877.

The Museum would like to stress that they will do all in their power to assist in making their exhibitions accessible to you. All they require is enough time to make arrangements.

Phones

Within snack bars, height may be a problem for some. MEMBERS SEATING

Divided into a lower section of uncovered seating and an upper section of covered grandstand seating.

Entry, at ground level, to right of disabled car park. Concreted throughout. All upper levels in the grandstand are accessible by ramp and a lift is available for officials, players and disabled patrons. Most seats however must be accessed by steps.

Wheelchair Access & Seating (VFL Park Members)

A. Transverse aisle (concourse), as with public seating (see above). B. Grandstand seats are undercover and behind last row of private boxes, most will not be able to see over these private boxes unless the rear door is opened.

Toilets (members' seating)

Helpful Hints, wheelchair users:

A. Watch out for gravel area in public arandstand behind gates, toilets and snackbar.

B. Keep in mind that wheelchair seating in the concourse is not covered and it is not possible to move undercover - and watch the game - when it rains. C. Sight is severely restricted by the
