

The Talent

The Tuest Choir is Australia's first inclusive choir and takes its name from the musical term 'Tuest', meaning everyone. From its origins in 1997 as a small singing group at Minda, the choir has grown into a vibrant independent multi arts organisation, deeply connected into the disability and mainstream arts worlds of South Australia and beyond. With its strong commitment to access and inclusion, Tuest is both a grass roots nurturer of disabled artists and a creator and presenter of high quality work with the vision of taking the work of Disabled artists to the world.

Club Tutti began in 2003 with 20 singers and in 2014 a second smaller group for beginners was established. Both groups are led by long time Tutti singer Jayne Hewetson and engage people with high support in an open friendly musical environment which builds confidence and offers a social network.

TKY - Tutti Kids and Youth program began in 2007 and is Adelaide's only out of school-hours multi-arts program specifically for children and youth living with disability. Led by specialist arts educators, TKY classes are once a week and offer small group activities in music, drama and movement. Today's performance is by young people from across all of our TKY sessions who have collaborated with their tutors Rachel Ceams and Lynne Brown to bring you a fun start to the concert.

The Sisters of Invention Aimee Crathern, Annika Hooper, Michelle Hall, Jackie Saunders and Caroline Hardy are all accomplished performers who have emerged through Tutti's music and performing arts programs. Together they are making history as the world's learning disabled electro-acoustic pop group "The Sisters of Invention". Their first music video launched last year attracted international media coverage and has gone platinum on YouTube. It was also selected for the Qantas inflight play list, screened at the United Nations headquarters in New York and recently screened at Parliament House Canberra for the National Inclusion Awards. With over one hundred public performances to their name, the group is in constant demand for concerts and this year launched their debut self-titled album to a capacity crowd at the Space Theatre. https://www.facebook.com/thesistersofinvention

Alistair Brasted (tenor) Alistair joined Tutti in 2003 to take the principal role in the Singing of Angels. Since then he has sung lead roles in Circles (2004), Between the Worlds (2005), Northern Lights, Southern Cross (2007), The Shouting Fence (2010), The Magic Flute (2012) and Eye Music in 2014. Alistair also sang regularly with the State Opera of South Australia and Peter Hopkins Vivace Choir. Highlight productions include Verdi's La Traviota, Wagner's Ring Cycle and Bizet's Cormen (2011).

Tutti Trove Joan Walsh, Jacqueline Boxall and Margo Wilson are experienced singers from the soprano section of the Tutti Choir who have discovered the pleasure of singing together. This is their first performance as a trio.

Tutti Choir Director/Conductor Laura Ellis is an Adelaide based singer/songwriter and accomplished performer with a passion for conducting. She brings a decade of experience of writing and performing original works to her role at Tutti. Laura teaches piano at various Adelaide Hills Primary Schools and has been with Tutti in the roles of guest and assistant conductor since 2011 until this year when she stepped into the role of Choir Director of both Poco Tutti and Tutti Choir.

Assistant Conductor Brenton Shaw brings composing, performing and musical direction skills to the role of assistant director and conductor. Stage credits include Les Miserable (2013), Bool (2010), and Eye Music (2014) and original collaborations Fire and Breath (2011) and Everybody Does Love Song (2012). In 2012 he was MD for the Australian premiere of Peter Pan: A Musical Adventure for Adelaide Youth Theatre and in 2013 received an Independent Arts Foundation grant to study at Minnesota State University. In 2014 he completed a BA with Honours in music composition. Brenton made his debut with Tutti in the 2002 Adelaide Festival production of Pat Rix's My Life, My Love and feels extremely humbled to conduct a choir he so dearly loves.

Richard Chew is a composer, singer and planist whose works have been performed locally, interstate and overseas. Richard has a long involvement with Tutti, principally as the choir's Musical Director however his recent move to Victoria to lecture at Federation University meant we had to bid him a fond farewell. Earlier this year, Richard directed and conducted the Australian premiere of his one act opera The Six Swans with Tutti Choir and final year performing arts students at University of SA. He joins the choirs for our End of Year concert as our Guest Planist. **Production Team**
