# Venue Profile

### Sports & Entertainment Centre (The Glasshouse)

This centre is one of the major sporting venues of the Olympic Park complex on Swan Street and was an Olympic size swimming Centre before being converted. During the basketball season, the venue is known as The Glasshouse.

Protection by the National Trust restricts major structural changes, even to improve access. Lyn Hunter, the event manager, has been exploring ways of improving access at the Centre despite these limitations.

Access has recently been improved with an audio loop in the stalls and one upstairs on south side rows D to I, seats 71 to 89. The fover telephone has been lowered and patrons using wheelchairs can sit in front of the tiered seating on floor level for some events. Wheelies can also sit in a specially designed area on the east side, accessible by ramps. Arrangements for wheelchairs are flexible depending on the particular event.

Ten reserved parking bays are set behind the Centre, off Batman Avenue, near the stage door. This leads directly to a ramp that leads to the wheelchair area. You need to ring to book the accessible bays on 9429 6288 before arriving. On the way in there is an accessible toilet converted from a dressing. The door is marked with the access symbol and is labelled 'Star Change 1'. Accessible cubicles are also in the men's and women's' toilets in the main foyer, which also has a baby change area.

EASE sells tickets to a wide range of events at the Centre, including concerts, The Great Moscow Circus on Ice and home games for the North Melbourne Giants Basketball Team.
