EASE offers the same price to support workers, family and friends accompanying the EASE client. EASE tickets are NOT available to people who do not qualify for assistance, especially staff, for their own personal use.

EASE staff take bookings from workers in the belief that the tickets are being fairly used. Please do not abuse the trust we place in you or the scheme will be placed in jeopardy.

In 1991 EASE booked and distributed almost 13,000 tickets to entertainment and sporting events in Melbourne and Geelong for clients in Melbourne, country Victoria and Adelaide. This is double the number of tickets distributed in 1989.

BASS

BASS is the largest ticketing service in Australia and sells tickets for most events.

BASS has a phone booking number for Credit Card bookings 11500 and Sportscharge 11522. There are also numerous outlets throughout Melbourne. If you book by phone you will get the best available tickets at the time and you will not have a choice about where you sit. If you require specific seats you will need to go to a BASS outlet where you can look at the seating plans and obtain basic information about access and facilities

If you cannot get to a BASS outlet and have special requirements for your seating you can call the BASS Customer Services numbers 685 881 or 685 8882 for information and bookings. Wheelchair Bookings are made directly with the venue where the event is on.

Independent Access

In the past two years EASE has doubled the number of tickets it distributes while maintaining the same staffing levels. One of the aims of the EASE service is to encourage independent access to entertainment by informing BASS and venues of the special requirements of our clients and facilitating change.

Free or Cheap Tickets: EASE keeps a list of people who are interested in free or cheap tickets which are usually available at short notice. If you can avail vourself of this service please call Lisa and join our list.

Ticket Requests: EASE will negotiate for tickets to any event at your request. Your name will be placed on a waiting list and EASE will contact you should we be successful.

Exchange and Refund Policy: There is NO exchange or refund on tickets booked with EASE so please be certain of your requirements before you make a booking. Both VISA and BASS have a No Refund, No Exchange policy. EASE is a service and although we place a commission on tickets it does not cover our operating costs. Uncollected, unused or returned tickets must be paid

M.T.C Season '92

The Melbourne Theatre Company recently launched their 10 play 1992 season, a season remarkable for its diversity of theme, style and period. Even if you're not a regular lover of theatre. I'm sure that at least one of the plays on offer will touch some area of interest to you.

The Melbourne Theatre Company's director, Roger Hodgeman, called the new 10 play season, "A balanced programme that will appeal to a large audience." " Our aim is to stimulate and entertain, and by the choice of repertoire and manner of presentation, to contribute to the development of Australia's culture," he said. The 1992 season reflects this aim with its exciting amalgam of theatrical styles featuring commissions of Australian works, the best of contemporary world drama, and the classics, both traditional and modern.

The EASE price for most tickets is approximately the concession price available through BASS although there are some exceptions. We therefore ask your support, particularly if you have a concession card or can afford to pay a little extra, by booking your tickets directly with BASS. EASE continues to expand its relationship with BASS and many of the problems that led to the establishment of Method of Payment: Payment can be made at the EASE office or by posting a cheque or money order made out to ARTS ACCESS. Payment is never made at the venue as EASE pays for all tickets at the time of booking. The price on the ticket is not always correct. Please make a note of the ticket price at the time of booking. Prompt payment for tickets is essential. Tickets must be paid for within two weeks of receiving your tickets and invoice. Please enclose invoice or details with your payment otherwise it is difficult to match up cheques with bookings.

Please remember that a booking is a financial commitment and that EASE must pay for the tickets at the time of booking in order to get you the best seats or the seats you need. If your payment is delayed it means that we cannot continue to make bookings and it puts the service in jeopardy for everyone.
